



This project started from a children's festival in 1997 and has been added to over the last few years. If you go to the website at www.natre.org.uk/db/ you will find two possibilities. The first is to look at the answers that are there (what others have said) and the second is to add your own comment (have your say).

You should start off by looking at what others have said. You can choose an age group (primary in the UK is ages 5 to 11 and secondary is ages 11-18), a gender and then the belief of the respondent. If you go to the orange box to the right of the screen you will have an advanced search, which gives you a greater choice of religions.

You might use this with your students to explore what children in the UK believe about God are there similarities or differences to how Hindus and Sikhs respond to this question? You might look at the questions about life after death or their hopes for the future. When you have explored some of the answers of other you can contribute to the database yourself.

This might be a project you could consider setting up in your own country in your own language in these days of cultural diversity this gives young people the chance to explore what other young people think on a range of issues. These could be religious, spiritual, moral, ethical or cultural questions.
